Ellis Island Gets Busy

This month marks the 100th anniversary of [Ellis Island's](http://www.ellisland.org) busiest day, April 17, 1907, when immigration officials processed 11,747 arrivals—more than twice the number of passengers entering the port on a typical day.

The Statue of Liberty-Ellis Island Foundation will celebrate the centennial with its annual Ellis Island Family Heritage Awards ceremony honoring three Americans with roots on the island: Duke University basketball coach Mike Krzyzewski, AARP director Bill Novelli and Morgan Stanley chairman John Mack. Filipino-American fashion entrepreneur Josie Natori will receive the Peopling of America Award, which goes to an American with roots in another time period or different port.

In all, 1,285,349 immigrants entered the United States in 1907, most from Southern and Eastern Europe. Ellis Island processed nearly 80 percent of those arrivals. You can search for Ellis Island passengers between 1892 and 1924 at <http://www.ellisland.org>.

[GenealogyBank.com](http://www.genealogybank.com) is giving free access to the 1819-1820 US Passenger List, a document the federal government published in 1821 (the secretary of state included the list with a letter) covering arrivals at 35 ports in 14 states and Washington, DC.
